Course Title: Algebra I

Course Standards/Objectives:

1. **NUMBER OPERATIONS AND CONCEPTS:** Students use numbers, number sense, and number relationships in a problem-solving situation.
2. **ALGEBRA:** Students use algebraic methods to investigate, model, and interpret patterns and functions involving numbers, shapes, data, and graphs in a problem-solving situation.
3. **DATA ANALYSIS AND PROBABILITY:** Students use data analysis and probability to analyze given situations and the results of experiments.

Textbook: *The University of Chicago School Mathematics Project Algebra*. This is a new textbook and curriculum for this year.

Calculators: Graphing calculators are an integral part of this curriculum. The school is purchasing classroom sets of graphing calculators. It is our recommendation that students have a TI84+ graphing calculator at home, if possible. They will be able to use this calculator in all high school math and science classes until calculus.

Homework	Homework is given virtually every. Homework should take between 45 and 60 minutes per night. Nightly homework will also include pre-reading the next day's section.	1 st quarter 15% 2 nd quarter 15% 3 rd quarter 10% 4 th quarter 10%

Writing Guidelines	On written work, students will be expected to follow the JHMS Cross-Curricular Writing Guidelines detailed in their agenda.	Included in normal grading

Homework: Homework is given virtually every day. Homework should take between 45 and 60 minutes per night. Students will grade their own homework and record their scores. Nightly homework will also include pre-reading the next day's section. If students choose to, they may redo missed problems on a separate paper, regrade, and use their improved score. Assignments with more than 30% of problems incorrect should have missed problems redone. All homework and notebooks for a particular unit are due at the beginning of the period on the day of the test. All homework must be completed in pencil!

Make Up Procedures: Students are responsible for keeping track of and making up missed work. If students are ill, parents may request make-up work on the second day of the illness. Since I provide an assignment sheet for the chapter, students are aware of the missed assignments. For every day absent due to illness, student have two days to make up the work. All assignments must be completed by the day of the test unless arrangements are made in advance.

If you know you will be absent from school, please bring a note from your parents and turn it in to our head secretary. She will give you a pre-excused absence form for you to fill out with your assignments. This should be completed at least two days prior to your absence. Make sure you are clear about the expectations and due dates of assignments before you leave.
